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Global Philanthropy


- More than 3 in 10 adults around the world donated money to charity in 2020
- Globally, nearly a fifth of all adults volunteer
- Donations are up across the board more people donated in 2020 than in the preceding 5 years



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
2020 contributions: \$471.44 billion by type of recipient organization*



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The Role of Mental Health Philanthropy in Florida

- Florida is among lowest amount of per capita mental health spending by state mental health agencies - \$36.05
- ▶ 7 out of 10 households in Florida make charitable donations
 - ▶ 74% give the majority of funds to organizations based in Florida
- Basic needs receive 14% of donations, Health: 11%

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Wealth in Florida

- Of 2,755 billionaires worldwide, and 735 in the U.S., 70 are in Florida
- ▶ Of 56.1M millionaires worldwide, and 21.95M in the U.S., approx. 1.26M millionaires are in Florida (about 500,000 households)



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What We Learned in 2020-2022

- Embracing innovation is more important than ever as a critical strategy

Adaptive Leadership Requires

- Articulation
 - Describe these needs to build collective understanding and support for action
 - Do this in a clear, rational, persuasive, urgent and flexible fashion



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Adaptive Leadership Requires

- Anticipation
 - Future needs, trends and options
 - Get the data (go outside of your circle)
 - Ask others for ideas on the future/options

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Adaptive Leadership Requires

- Adaptation
 - Be nimble, so there is continuous learning and possible adjustments of responses as necessary
 - Be the continuing learner for the group, and they will follow suit



Adaptive Leadership Requires


- Accountability
 - Includes maximum transparency in decision-making processes and openness to challenges and feedback
 - This is a maturity factor with confidence that the other characteristics have been met

- Office-first company models are eroding
 - When you have talented staff, you find a way to make this work
